A final letter has been sent to those with outstanding taxes owing, up to and including 2012. Residents who received this letter and did not reply will have their information sent to a collection agency. Interest is being applied to all outstanding taxes, including 2012 taxes, invoices with the interest added will be in the mail in March 2013. Tax payments can be made by monthly instalments. Payments are accepted by Visa, Debit, MasterCard, cheques and cash as well as post - dated cheques, at the town office between the hours of 8:30 to 4:30, Monday to Friday.

Recycling Dates

The next dates for recycling are attached. Please note that the dates for July were incorrect in the last newsletter. Residents are asked to have your recycling out with your garbage by 8:00 am on those dates. Remember greasy containers such as chicken boxes and buckets as well as pizza boxes are not recyclable. Just a reminder, you can drop off your recyclables, the ones you pay a deposit on, to the Town Hall. These recyclables [remove corks and covers] are going into an account at the Evergreen Recycling Depot and all money raised will go to the Flatrock Recreation Program. If you would like to donate your recycling to the Flatrock Recreation Program, drop them off at the Evergreen Recycling Depot marked "Town of Flatrock". The amount the Recration Program earned from recyclables in 2012 was \$354.10

Syringes

Fast food containers ex: chicken buckets

ALUMINUM CONTAIERS

Pop and Beer Cans Baking trays, pie plates, etc...

TIN CANS

Soup cans, coffee cans, beans, tuna cat food, etc....

PLASTIC CONTAINERS

Water, pop, and liquor bottles (no Egg covers or tops)
Condiments ex.: barbeque sauce ketchup, mustard, honey, etc...
Household cleaners ex.: dish and Laundry detergent, bleach,
Windex, etc...
Plastic containers marked on the bottom #1, 2, 4, 5, 7 ex: yogurt, ice cream etc...
Tetra boxes ex.: juice boxes, soups

Tetra boxes ex.: juice boxes, soups Gable Tops ex.: milk and juice cartons

If you want to donate your items to the Recreation program, please drop them off at the Town Garage next to the gate. Please do not block the fire exit. (These items would be what you pay a deposit on)

Please make sure that the plastic bottles and containers are rinsed and lids and caps are removed. Please place your recycling with your garbage bags on recycling pick up day.
